Plug In To The Power Of Pentecost!

Just before Jesus ascended into heaven, he gave his disciples a powerful promise. He said, **“John baptized with water, but in a few days, you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit...You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”**
Acts 1:5, 7-8

Jesus fulfilled his promise 10 days later when he poured out the Holy Spirit upon his disciples in a special way on Pentecost. The visible signs of the Holy Spirit's presence were the sound of a blowing wind, tongues of fire that came to rest on the disciples, and granting them the ability to speak in tongues, that is, to preach the Gospel in a foreign language they had never learned before. God used this miraculous event to share the Gospel with people gathered in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven.

Inwardly, the Holy Spirit filled the disciples with power, courage and conviction to live their faith and to share their faith with others. Through the power of his Word he empowered them to be bold witnesses for Jesus Christ. Read the book of Acts and you will witness the Spirit's work in action.

But Jesus' promise to pour out the Holy Spirit upon his disciples was not just limited to those chosen disciples in Jerusalem 2000 years ago. Today, Jesus still pours out the Holy Spirit upon us in a powerful way through the means of grace, the Gospel in Word and sacraments. Consider the power of your baptism. Through this washing of rebirth and renewal, the Holy Spirit created faith in your heart and granted you new life in Christ. He turned you from darkness to light and from the power of Satan to God. Consider the power of Holy Communion. Through this life giving meal Jesus not only washes away all your sin and guilt, but he also sweeps away all your doubts about his love for you, gives you his own strength to live a God-pleasing life, and grants you a joyful foretaste of heaven. Through the power of God's Word, he enables you to defeat sin, overcome temptation, and reject false teaching. The Gospel is the living and

active force the Holy Spirit uses to set our hearts on fire with peace, hope, joy, and love. What power the Holy Spirit puts at our disposal! What blessings he desires to bring to our hearts and daily lives! This summer don't cut yourself off from these awesome blessings by missing out on worship, skipping Bible study, or failing to receive Holy Communion. Don't be guilty of despising preaching and God's Word! Come, grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ! Plug into the power and purpose of Pentecost!

Dear Members of Hope,

At this time this proposal is under the review of the Planning Committee. The Planning Committee will assist in developing a complete proposal to take to Council. There is a lot of work to do just to get this proposed project to a point that a decision can be made. Please keep this project and all those involved in your prayers.

As we move through this year we count our blessings. We are growing, our school continues to be a blessing to our members and to the community and we continue to "Grow in Grace and Share the Gospel". VBS is just around the corner and there are many other Outreach projects that are planned or are being discussed. Please stay in tune with the Calendar and with announcements to find ways to serve and fellowship.

MISGUIDED LOVE

Those who love money will never have enough. How absurd to think that wealth brings happiness!

The more you have, the more people come to help you spend it. So what is the advantage of wealth - except perhaps to run through your fingers! - Ecclesiastes 5:10-11.

The book of Ecclesiastes includes one of the most important financial truths you'll ever hear. If you love money and things it can buy, better budgeting, a higher-paying job, or even a winning lottery ticket can't make you happy or alleviate your financial worries. The only deciding factor that you can really depend on is to decide to pursue a fresh, new focus.

Love focuses on what it desires. When you desire God, you spend your time and energy getting to know him better and doing what pleases him. When you desire money, you spend your time and energy fueling an atmosphere of greed, instead of nurturing a sense of contentment. A deep desire for wealth can tempt you to do things you normally wouldn't consider, like cheating, lying or stealing. You don't need to do anything illegal to fall for temptations like these. All it takes is holding on to the riches God has given you with a tight grip instead of opening your arms, and hoarding your blessings instead of sharing them.

The book of Ecclesiastes is all about how meaningless life is apart from God. Pursuing riches more vigorously than a relationship with God will lead you to only one place - an impoverished life (even if your bank account seems to say otherwise!). Instead of focusing on money, focus on God, the source of wealth. Thank him daily for how he has blessed you and share what he has so generously given to you. You will find yourself rich in joy and contentment.

Money promises more than it can ever deliver. God will never do that to you. The treasures he promises his children are both certain and eternal.

Due to the severe Synod budget cuts, funding for the Sacramento Hmong Mission has been cut effective May 31st. St. Andrew Lutheran is committed to continuing the Hmong Outreach and Pastor Ger Lor is willing to continue the outreach effort as a Tent Minister. He will seek outside employment in the city, county, or state.

Pastors Sonntag and Lor request the following:

1. Prayer – knowing that God wants all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. Many of the Hmong believe that the devil is god and that all who die, go to hell to reunite with their ancestors. They believe that they do not have a choice – they must go to hell.
2. Ask God to give St. Andrews the wisdom to know HIS will. The Mission Board, Pastor Lor, Pastor Sonntag, and the Hmong people do not want the ministry to be discontinued.
3. Pray that Pastor Lor can find employment .
4. Support this work with a gift to St. Andrew Hmong Mission. To aid this effort, Hope will have a special door offering on Sunday, June 7th will all money collected to be forwarded to St. Andrew Hmong Mission.

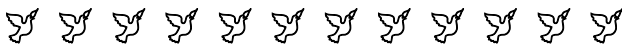

GOD'S GRACE GOES WITH THEM **From the office of President Mark Schroeder**

Last weekend my family and I witnessed firsthand the benefits and blessings of one of our synod's ministry programs. My son, Zach, is a member of the Wisconsin National Guard. His unit was mobilized for deployment to Iraq, and for the last two months he and his fellow soldiers have been in training in Fort Bliss near El Paso, Tex. He was given four days of leave at the end of the training before he would depart for Iraq, so we gathered as a family to bid him farewell and Godspeed.

Since 3,000 members of the Wisconsin National Guard are involved in this deployment, you would correctly assume this group would include several dozen WELS soldiers. Recognizing that, WELS Military Services planned a special farewell worship service at Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in El Paso. Pastor Paul Ziemer serves in a part-time position as the director of our efforts to serve WELS military personnel and their families around the world. He delivered a powerful and touching sermon that specifically addressed these soldiers and their families. The soldiers and their families also received the Lord's Supper, with its assurance of our oneness with God and with each other as his believers.

It was a bittersweet day for the many soldiers and their families who attended this service. There were some tears and fears. There were eyes filled with concern about the unknown. At the same time, however, with the strength and comfort provided by the Word of God, there was a clear sense that these soldiers and their families had an underlying trust in

God and a confidence in his protective care, not to mention a sense of pride and appreciation. I can say this not just as an observer, but as a participant.

I am thankful for the efforts of our synod to serve the men and women of our armed forces and their families. These efforts operate with a very small budget and with limited personnel, but the spiritual benefits provided to our troops are beyond calculation. Please remember this work, along with the brave men and women this work serves, in your prayers.
